Oppositional Defiant Disorder is a behavioural disorder where students exhibit uncooperative, hostile, and defiant behaviours.

Conduct Disorder is a type of behavioural disorder where students don't understand basic social standards.



Causes of ODD

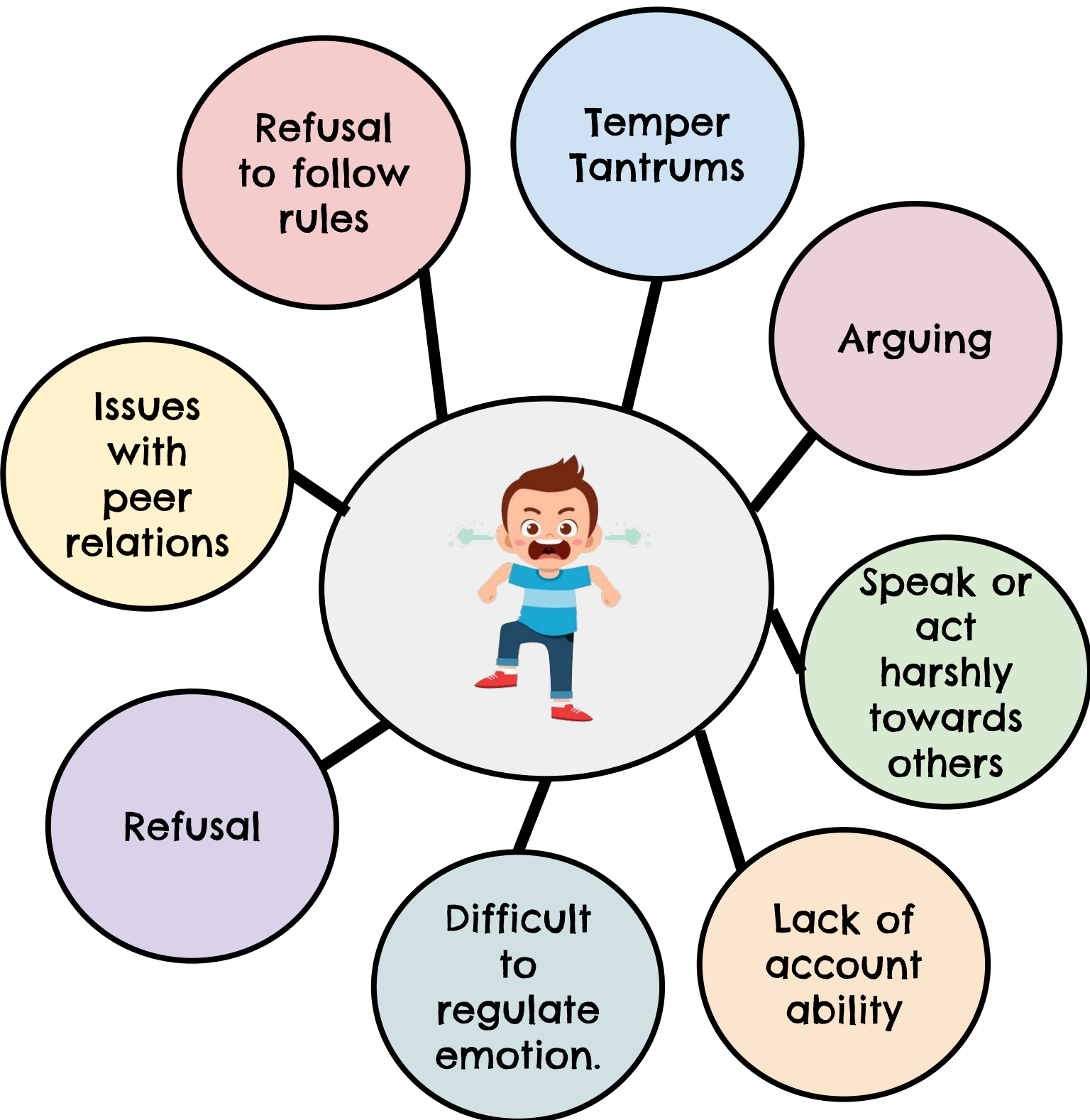
Developmental Theory

The developmental theory suggest that ODD is tied to learning difficulties and students struggling to become independent.

Learning Theory

The learning theory suggest that ODD is a learned behavior that is created through negative reinforcement from parents and caregivers.

ODD and Conduct Disorder Interventions

Tier 1 Interventions

Give Choice

Providing students with choice helps to prevent and argument and gives the student a sense of accountability.

Clear Expectations

Set out clear expectation for the students so they know the expectations. Stay consistent with the expectations.

Visual Schedules

Visual schedules can help avoid conflicts at times of transition by allowing the students to prepare ahead of time.

Tier 2 & 3 Interventions

Behavioral

- Mentor programs
- Signals
- Positive reinforcement

Academic

- Have a break
- Extra time in assignments
- Break assignment into further chunks.

Environmental

- Proximity
- Calming environment
- Organization of objects
