Book: Wacky Wednesday by Dr. Seuss

Grade One

Book Summary & Relevance & Curricular Outcome

This book follows a young child who wakes up and notices something is very wrong in their bedroom. As they move through the book the child encounters more weird and wacky things throughout the neighbourhood.

This book could be used to tie in CR1.1 Comprehend and respond to a variety of grade-level texts (including contemporary and traditional visual, oral, written, and multimedia) that address: identity (e.g., All About Me), community (e.g., Friends and Family), social responsibility (e.g., Conservation) and relate to own feelings, ideas, and experiences.

(e) Describe characters, the way they might feel, and the way situations might cause them to feel. The child will be able to relate to the child in the story as they go to school, they have interactions with peers, how they would feel in the child's situation, and how they can seek a police officer for help.

Cross Curricular Outcomes

MATH- N1.1

Say the number sequence, 0 to 100, by:

1s forward and backward between any two given numbers

2s to 20, forward starting at 0

5s and 10s to 100, forward starting at 0.

*This outcome works great with this book, because the children need to find and count all the items on each page. Repetition counting from 1-20

Social Studies- DR1.3

Demonstrate awareness of humans' reliance on the natural environment to meet needs, and how location affects families in meeting needs and wants.

*This outcome could work with this book because we can see throughout the book the child's environment being affected. The location of items affects people throughout the book and the child is the only one aware of the craziness of it all.

*This outcome could work for this book because the child observes characteristics of items, changes of appearances of items and how behaviour of people change throughout the book.






