Indigenous peoples

The original inhabitants of a land; this term applies to peoples all over the world

Culture

A learned way of living, including language, beliefs, arts, sports, and food, that is shared by a group of people

Society

A structured community of people bound together by similar traditions, institutions, or nationality

Indian Act

A federal act that regulates the lives of First Nations peoples in Canada; originally passed in 1876

Reserve

Land set aside for the occupation and use of First Nations in exchange for giving up claim to their traditional territories; title to the land remains with the federal government

Pacific Rim countries

Lands that border on, or are contained in, the basin of the Pacific Ocean that share political, economic, and environmental interests

Multiculturalism

A policy supporting the existence of many distinct cultural groups in one society

Community

A group of people with at least one thing in common, such as shared location, interests, values, experiences, or traditions

Resource

The raw materials or component parts of a finished product that may include natural resources, human resources, and capital resources (equipment and buildings)

Nation

a country, such as Canada, or a group of people with a shared sense of national identity, such as the Metis.

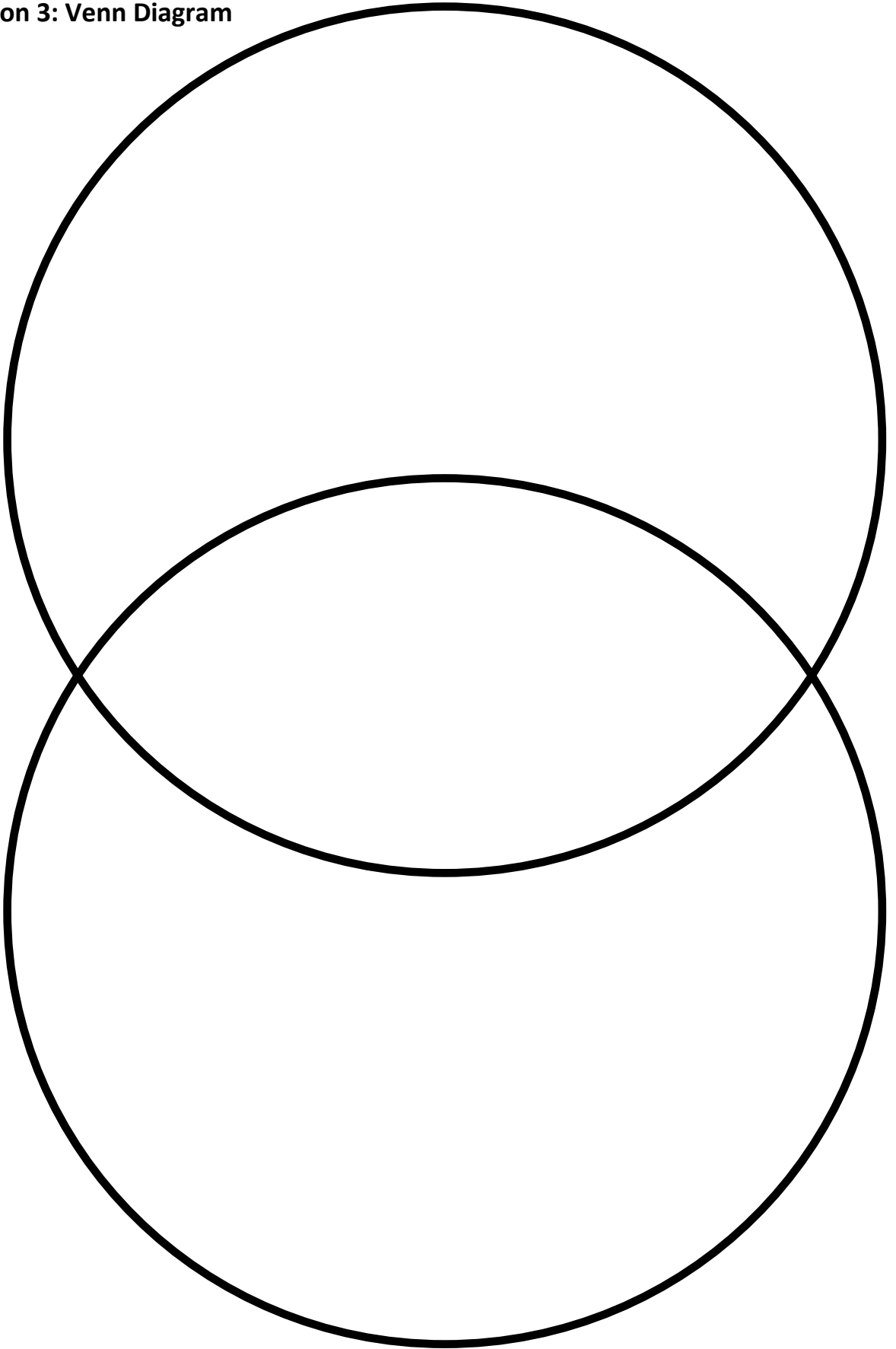
