I check them daily and water them as needed, especially during hot weather. I do also have a weeping water hose set up in the raised beds on a timer, so they get regular watering daily. If you are not familiar with a weeping garden hose, they are designed to release water slowly. This minimizes water waste and ensures the plants receive the precise amount of water they need. Gardening is peaceful, and I always feel refreshed by the fresh air and being surrounded by beautiful plants is soothing.
