Grade:	Grade ½
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Taught to: Grade ¹/₂

Subject: Health

Time Frame: 1 hour

Content: In this activity students will be introduced to self and begin exploring traditions that shape our sense of self. Presentation Set: (15 min)

Good afternoon students today we are going to be talking about self and traditions that contribute to self. First can someone tell me what self is. Yes, your right, self is who we are and can be influenced by many different things. What kinds of things do you think might influences a person's identity? Yes, those are all great influences some other things that influence your identity are stories celebrations and traditions. Okay now I am going to give everyone 3 minutes to think of one special celebration, story or tradition that makes you unique.

GIVE 3 MINUTES TOO WORK

Okay now we are going to go around the class and share our one thing we thought of. GO AROUND THE CIRCLE AND SHARE. Okay now I will share my one tradition that makes me unique. The one tradition I am going to share with you is family Christmas cookie making.

Development: (45 min)

Every year the week approaching up to Christmas my family bakes and decorates Christmas cookies. There is a very specific process that we make and decorate cookies, while listening to Christmas carols, which make me unique. I am going to share each step with you now.

Closure: (10 min) CLEAN UP SUPPLIES

Okay now we are going to share our work with our other classmates so leave you cookies on your desk and we will do a walk about gallery. Hold your hands behind your back and look with your eyes.

Okay great work today everyone. Head back to your seats and you can eat one of your cookies while we listen to Tough Cookie
